

DON'T FORGET TO FLUFF!



REGULAR MAINTENANCE

While the cover is designed to minimize feather escape, it cannot eliminate it completely. Some feather escape will happen. There is a tradeoff between comfort, breathability and containing the feathers.

The cover selected balances an acceptable amount of feather escape with maintaining a level of softness.

A feather cushion requires more maintenance. While the baffled cover is designed to minimize shifting, the nature of a loose fill topper is that the feathers and fibre are free to shift. This means the cushion will exhibit a “lived in look.” This shabby-chic look is the desired look of this cushion.

Fluffing and rotating the cushions frequently will be required. For those customers who prefer a more tailored look or have feather allergies, feather seating is NOT recommended.

Pilling

As a result of normal wear and use, upholstered fabrics will begin to form little balls, or “pills,” of excess fabric on the surface. This is called pilling, a common characteristic of many upholstered fabrics. Pilling is not considered a defect by Fabric Manufacturers because the fabric is not actually deteriorating. Over time, when all excess fibres have been released from the fabric, the pilling will stop. To restore the look of the material, we recommend occasionally “shaving” the product’s surface with a furniture or sweater shaver.

Don't fret, wrinkling is a standard feature of feather styles and requires regular maintenance.

- Cushions must be fluffed regularly to maintain their shape.
- Keep out of direct sunlight, prolonged exposure may cause fabric to fade.
- See selected fabric for cleaning instructions. An occasional feather may poke through the ticking and fabric.
- Wrinkling on seat and back cushions is normal for feather styles
